Dear Friends

When I was in Caithness I remember Donald MacKay, Prof. of Communication, University of Keele, illustrating the link between Science and Faith : “Imagine coming up to traffic lights and wondering about the size/strength of the bulb and the shade of red - all interesting individual questions. But if you don’t stop, you’ve missed the point... and smash!!”



That came back to me as I looked round St John’s : the beautiful windows displaying aspects of Christ’s life, the tapestry of Jesus on the cross next to the war memorials, the carvings on the west side of the Knox Chapel, “The Rising Son - all interesting individual pieces of art/architecture. But if folk don’t see the overall message of God’s loving action in Jesus, they’ve missed the point!

When young people are told information they are inclined to say “So what?” They look for relevance for their life, their world. The great thing about St John’s is that it is not just historical or architectural information - to look on it that way is to miss the point!

In St John’s building we have a great resource which illustrates God’s loving action, e.g. the cross reminding us of historical evidence, with the communion table extending God’s invitation to everyone to experience a living relationship with Him. We have the great privilege and responsibility of helping people see the meaning of the illustrations so that they don’t miss the point of life!



As we come up to the 900th year of Christian witness on St John’s site, in a world where the speed of change is accelerating, we affirm that “Jesus Christ is the same, yesterday, today and forever”, the source of secure identity, personal stability and dynamic hope.

Faith is personal, but it is not private. St John’s is named after John the Baptist, who in his day challenged the corruption and disintegration of family life, and pointed to Jesus. St John’s has a history of close link with the community, e.g. St Johnstone football club. As good stewards of God’s grace we are to be Jesus’ pacesetters in the community, with our time, finance and influence available to Him

Jesus encouraged questions! Over the summer we plan to look at some issues Christians find hard to deal with in interface with non-Christians. If anyone has suggestions about an issue do let me know ...I’m happy to try to help either in a service if appropriate or personally.

If you are wondering about becoming a Christian, making a profession of faith or transferring membership to St John's do let me know : you will be most welcome!

Save St John's Kirk – Update

Musical Chairs and Fundraising Progress

Just before Easter, John Kinloch sadly had to resign from all his roles in the Kirk and Trust to prioritise his own health and caring for his family. John has done so much for the Kirk, and you will find a longer tribute to him below.

John has been crucial in leading our fundraising efforts as our Property Convener, and his necessary standing down from this role came at a key juncture for our fundraising target of £2.3M. It was therefore agreed that it was essential for Bill Wilson to take on that role as the only other elder with a detailed knowledge of what the project involved. To do so he had to step down from being the Clerk.

Fortunately, Margaret Steele has agreed to become the Session Clerk once again, initially for 3 months, to allow this to happen.

At the end of June we were able to report to our Stated Annual Meeting that:

- at the end of December 2024 the General Trustees agreed to permit us to raise £2.3M
- At the start of February, the Government announced that the Listed Places of Worship scheme that allows places of worship to reclaim VAT would be limited to £25,000 for each claimant, only until March 2026. This raised the target required for our Project to £2.8M
- In February we applied to the NLHF for £625,000. On 26th June we received the written confirmation that they had approved our application, split into 2 phases: a Development Phase for £147,326 to prepare detailed plans, to be submitted in October as part of a further Application for funding for the Delivery Phase of £477,674, which if approved will allow contractors to be appointed to begin work on site in May 2026.
- A number of other funding applications will now be completed, including one to Historic Environment Scotland, also for £625,000 which had to be submitted by 30th June.
- The Appeals Committee will be considering how and when to approach the Congregation and wider Community for their support.

We would like to pay tribute to our professional Fundraiser, Louisa Evans for successfully guiding our NLHF application through a very challenging and competitive funding environment to achieve this success. Much remains to be done but we have made it across some major hurdles and remain optimistic.

Since needs change over the years, we encourage you to leave a gift in your Will for the general purposes of the congregation rather than for a restricted purpose. We will discuss possible uses of your gift with your executors when the time comes, bearing in mind your known areas of interest in the church and the church's priorities at the time.

You can be confident that your gift will be used to make a real difference to our future mission and ministry.

We will acknowledge gifts in whatever way the donor and/or his/her executors feel most appropriate. If preferred, we can make sure that gifts remain anonymous.

Without this project going ahead St John's would undoubtedly slowly but surely, cease to exist in the form that we know it today. No one person could carry on at the rate that Bill has done and he has wisely made the decision to stand down as Session Clerk to enable him to concentrate on the project.

We shall miss his calm measured approach to things but this now seems to be the right time for Bill to travel forward into another venture.

We are all going to miss having him as our Session Clerk and welcome Margaret into this leadership position, all be it with a bit of a different agenda, but today, of course we shall miss him. I personally shall miss him a lot.

Retiring Elder - John Kinloch



Many of you will now know that John Kinloch has sadly had to stand down from all the positions that he held for St John's due to concerns about his health. After a remarkably short period when he was unable to worship with us on Sundays, we have been delighted to see him back with us and he has even come back to singing in the Choir, but rightly feels he needs to prioritise his family and his health.

What few will know is just how much John has done for St John's over many years. John is so highly regarded wherever he has applied his time and talents, and part of the reason is his great sense of humour. Any group that has John participating will quickly be relaxed and laughing. In 2001 when he was the Presbytery Elder for another church, he was asked by Presbytery to represent them on the Trust. What a blessing to us this proved to be because when John takes on a job he never does so half-heartedly. John brought to the Trust his experience of serving his own farming community on the Scottish Land Court. He also served Presbytery as Convener of their Planning Committee, a challenging role even then.

By 2006 the Trust had asked John to become their chairman, which put him in a pivotal role to work with Michael Thomson and David Ogston on the very successful Vision for the Future project. This raised £2.3M to upgrade the interior of the Kirk, adding toilets, offices and new seating in 2010/11. Charlie Fraser Trust Secretary, remembers the many hours that John and Michael spent in his offices planning how to sell their Vision to funders and publicise their plans.

Following the success of the Vision for the Future, John became a member of the Kirk, and a member of Session. In 2017 he agreed to become the Property Convener and very soon found himself once more taking on major fundraising, when he discovered that the spire was leaking badly. John's experience, persistency and diplomacy has been crucial in making the progress we have. Persistency has been one of John's most valuable characteristics as we faced the scepticism of so many essential organisations that held gateway permission roles. Overcoming those took 7 years.

Getting to the stage where we have the support of the General Trustees in December 2024 enabled us to apply to our first gateway funder, the National Lottery Heritage Fund. John's guiding hand in developing the application to NLHF, who have just approved our application for up to £625,000 owes so much to his knowledge and judgement.

Truly John Kinloch has done so much for St John's, well beyond those mentioned here, and he, Jeanette and their daughter Karen have brought us so many blessings.

Thank you, John. Your wisdom will be sorely missed, and we wish you and all your family many blessings.

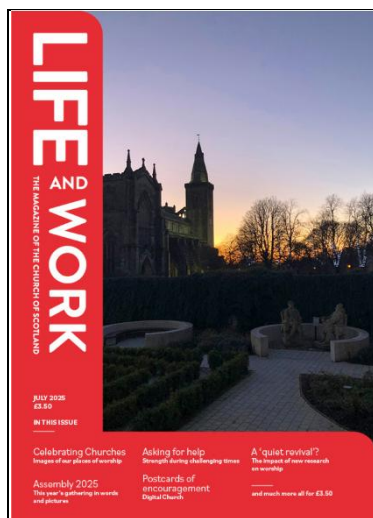
