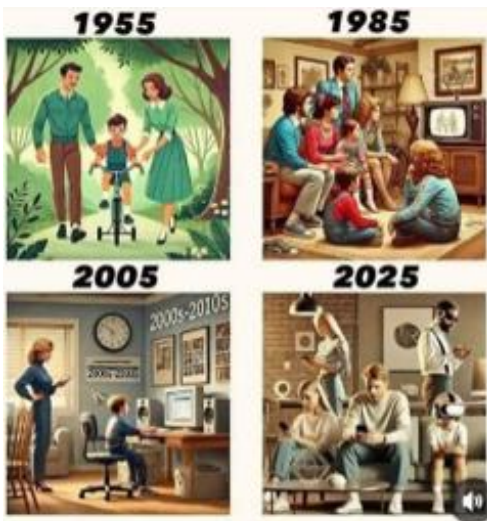

Dear Friends



In the midst of all the changes and uncertainties on a global and national level, Easter provides security with a note of **HOPE!**



For a while society was inclined to think that truth was whatever seemed true to a person. However, with the rise of AI - which can lead to information being manipulated into FakeNews - people are realising the importance of objective truth. (This was written before a certain “statesman” said that Ukraine started the war with Russia!)

The evidence for the cross and resurrection has been subjected to more verification than other events, coming out with flying colours as objective truth in the public arena. The evidence of Easter is the basis of celebrating that death and evil do not have the final say! The God behind the universe is made known in Jesus, inviting us to enter a living relationship with Him! It is not a religious system, it is a living relationship embodied in the One Who said “**I am the Truth**”. It is not mere good views : it is **GOOD NEWS**, the ultimate security for time and eternity!

Some thoughts about how we can show and share this good news “overflowing with hope” (Rom 15.13) :

- i. housebound folk are welcome to have **communion at home** - just mention it to your elder.
- ii. we are in the process of resuming **tea/coffee after the 10.00am service** - if you would like to help, do pass on your willingness.
- iii. those who would like to be involved in a **bible study and/or prayer group**, please let Lucy Pringle or myself know. For example there could be prayer information, Bible Studies or short courses on communicating the message of Jesus in this uncertain 21st century.
- iv. to ensure the continuation of St John’s it is necessary to fulfil its mission plan e.g. with enough **Kirk Stewards** - if you can help please let me know and I’ll pass on your info to Kay Morrison
- v. a number of **leaflets** about St John’s are near the door for sharing. Also a booklet is available on request with a short thought and prayer for each morning and evening in a week.

vi. statistics show that the most frequent way in which someone becomes a Christian is when a Christian friend chats with them and invites them to some event, e.g. a church service.

It may help to know that at **communion services** gluten-free bread is also available separately wrapped, and as well as dark alcoholic wine, there will be non-alcoholic wine appearing lighter.

Mutual encouragement is a feature of the vibrant early church. I am grateful to those elders and others who are caring, especially when they are able to share friendships or routine pastoral connections over many years. **But if you wish to chat with me about anything e.g.**

- ... from (grand)children's questions about the Christian faith,
- ... thinking about becoming a member by transfer or profession, and
- ... coping with a traumatic incident in the home or family,
- ... to terminal care in the family or making funeral plans

Session Clerk

Since becoming our Locum at the start of the year, Sandy Gunn has given us a huge amount of encouragement and support. From his decades of supporting churches across Presbytery, Sandy recognises the challenges that we face but affirms his belief in our enormous potential. Having already assisted us last year to prepare some of our leaflets for visitors, such as the admired "Who was John the Baptist" leaflet with its experimental use of QR codes, Sandy is applying his strong grasp of technology to our advantage. He is also using the knowledge and contacts he has built up as a member of the Government's Schools Inspectorate to prepare curriculum-oriented materials that will make St John's an appealing place for Schools to visit.



Our professional fundraiser, Louisa Evans has been providing us with some very large documents for the Kirk Session to review, (such as a draft Business Plan), which we have found very challenging. But they are all needed to support our fundraising efforts if potential funders are to be persuaded to support us. These fundraising tasks are still being led by the team chaired by Brigadier Sir Mel Jameson, supported by Trust, Friends and Kirk Session representatives.

In his Saving St John's update below, John Kinloch gives us very good news about these fundraising efforts. The Fundraising Team are increasingly confident that our target is achievable. The National Lottery Heritage Fund (NLHF) has helpfully asked

us to apply to them in two phases. The first application, which was submitted at the end of February, will be to fund the development work needed to prepare Architectural and Engineering plans to identify the detail of the work that will begin, we hope in 2026. If this Development application is approved, our second NLHF 'Delivery phase' application will be submitted in the autumn, with these detailed plans. We hope that by summer 2026 the Kirk will once more have scaffolding around its tower to carry out the work to make our 500-year-old spire and flat roofs fully watertight,. The internal work to make the West Door accessible would follow in autumn 2026.

While the St John's 'Stone Ship' that was described by George Mackay Brown in his 1991 poem about the Kirk, is gliding in the right direction, there is a lot of paddling going on below the surface.

Fund Raising

Save St John's Kirk – Update



It is really encouraging to report that this project now enjoys the full support of the General Trustees and that our applications to the National Lottery Heritage Fund and to Historic Environment Scotland are going forward on the basis that this is a partnership between St John's, the Friends, the Trust, and the General Trustees. We are also heartened by offers of support locally and from the General Trustees.

Perth & Kinross Council is also being quietly supportive.

On the downside, we have been hit by a new restriction on reclaiming VAT and by the delays of last year. Inevitably, these adversely affect the cost of the project even although NLHF and HES will take them into account in considering our application for funding.

Our team of consultants led by LDN Architects are pressing on with the preliminary investigations and design work. Going forward to the next stages and in compliance with best practice we will – as for contractor – go out to tender for the appointment of consultants, so the team may change but the work will continue.

Inevitably, we are having to carry much of these development costs even although success is as yet uncertain. The plans are sound and achievable: we must go forward in faith.

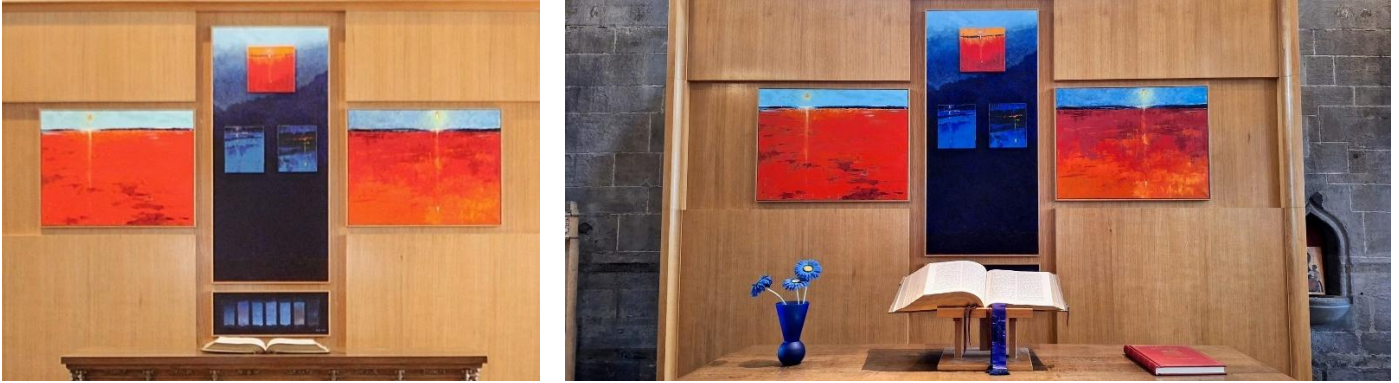

History

Hugh Murdoch, *The Rising Son*, Oil, 2000



The large artwork behind the communion table in the John Knox Chapel was painted by local artist Hugh Murdoch (1945 -2010).

Mr Murdoch was born in Dundee, and graduated from Edinburgh College of Art in 1969. In the 1970s he worked as an illustrator and teacher. In the early 1990s Mr Murdoch worked as Arts Development Officer with Capability Scotland, and did interactive theatre, dance and visual arts projects at Upper Springland. Mr Murdoch was celebrated for his dynamic use of colour and expressive compositions, painted in his studio at Lethangie near Loch Leven, where he also created a renowned garden.

The *Rising Son* painting was acquired in 2001 by St John's Kirk thanks to the generosity of an anonymous donor.

Mr Murdoch described the artwork, "The painting represents the themes of creation and resurrection and within the painting seascapes have been used to portray these themes. The work is made up of several smaller paintings within the larger canvas. The small painting at the bottom of the cross represents the seven days of creation, which is symbolised through the different aspects of the sea and moon. The two paintings making up the arms of the cross represent the crucifixion. The centre piece is made up of three small paintings - the two larger parts represent the two thieves who were crucified with Christ, and the top painting represents the resurrection. In the centre of the work, the small paintings are seen rising through the darkness into light, symbolising the theme of the Resurrection and the Light."

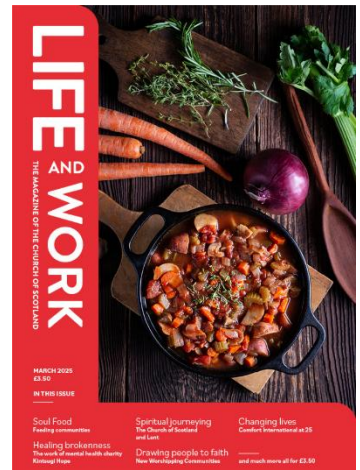

Shoebox Appeal 2024

85,000 filled boxes were sent out to 8 countries in Eastern Europe in 2024, slightly up on the previous year. Blythswood's chief executive Jeremy Ross said, "At a time when many families are struggling to pay bills at home, it's testimony to how generous people can be to those in greatest need." More than one third of the boxes went to Ukraine with 5 lorry loads carrying over 31,000 to cities including Kyiv and Odessa.

Water Aid Lenten Appeal 2025

Throughout Lent last year we filled individual empty 'Jars of Grace' with loose change (or cheques) for Water Aid. We will be encouraging people to do the same this year.

Clean water, decent toilets and good hygiene help people to break free from poverty and change their lives for good.

Jars should be returned to the Kirk on Sunday the 27 April 2025.

Stamp Appeal 2025-26

Postage stamps can be placed in the box at the table at the West Door. Stamps are sent to support the work of the Royal National Institute for the Blind and the Al Ahli hospital in Northern Gaza.

Perth Shawl Ministry

"You formed my innermost being; you knit me together in my Mother's Womb"
Psalm 139:13

The "Parish Grouping Prayer Shawl Ministry: was introduced to Perth by Rev. Ellen Marquardt, a visiting Pastoral Assistant from America for St John's Kirk and St Leonard's in the Fields and also Catherine Wallace, a Church of Scotland Deacon, who had recently returned from America with her husband Rev. Jim Wallace. Ellen, Catherine and I met and prayerfully discussed the possibility of how we might introduce a group here in Perth, and so we were delighted when Ellen was able to write in our newsletter.



On 13 November 2010, with the click of knitting needles and the buzz of happy conversation, 33 women from the four City Centre Parish Grouping congregations laid the foundation for a shared Prayer Shawl Ministry Group.

During the following 14 years our group continues to offer a variety of shawls to celebrate happy occasions as well as comfort those in sad times. However, during this time our mission to serve the Community of Perth & Kinross Area continues to develop.

Projects as well as our Local Community:

- Seafarers Aberdeen - Hats and Neck Warmers
- NICU Ninewells - Premature and Newborn hats, cardi's, blankets and little car seat covers etc. all done to specific patterns
- Blythswood - Blankets made with knitted squares, Snoods, Hats and gloves etc, over and above shoe boxes donated made by people personally.

We have a contact within Perth & Kinross Council who is part of a team called Fieldwork Support Team and they work alongside other groups who support children and families who certainly need lots of help.

- Some toys were distributed to the pantry/ foodbank. The rest of the toys in the appeal were given to local families in Perth, identified by Health Education and Social Work of being in need.
- The stockings were given to the adults in their Christmas bags.
- Workmates of our contact donated £140 for some of our knitted items and the money was used to buy presents for two teenagers in need.
- A doll gifted in a shoebox with knitted bedding etc was given to the Pantry for their Christmas raffle and another given to the community shop to raise funds for them.
- Lots of knitted items and new clothes were handed in to the teams in Perth to distribute to clients.

Sadly, many of our members are no longer with us and we treasure the memories we shared together. We have welcomed several new people and continue to do so.

One thing that has not changed is the traditional prayer of blessing that we say together during each meeting.

"May God's grace be upon these gifts for others:
warming, comforting, enfolding and embracing.
May they be safe havens:
sacred places of security and well-being...
sustaining and embracing in good times,
as well as difficult ones.
May those who receive them be cradled in hope,
Kept in joy, graced with peace and wrapped in love.
Blessed be!
Amen.
